You will be informed via email from your child's homeroom teacher of their reading level, and it's essential that the books chosen for the reports are on this level. This ensures that they are appropriately challenged while still being able to comprehend and enjoy the material. Reading on their level will also help build confidence and foster a love for reading.

To assist you in selecting appropriate books, we have attached a list of recommended fiction and non-fiction chapter books. These books cover a range of topics and genres, providing options that cater to various interests. Feel free to explore these suggestions with your child and choose books that spark their curiosity and excitement. Again, all three book reports must be handed on on the first day of the 2024-2025 school year. The book reports will be graded and count towards your child's first marking period grade.
