- Each section is completed with proper grammar and punctuation.

In addition to their chosen report book, the students will choose two more books from the list to read. The A-Z Reading level is noted with each book, but students may choose which books they like. These choices will be just to read, with no book report attached.

If your students are already familiar with the books on the list, or if they want specific recommendations in genres they like, please don't hesitate to reach out this summer. I love to share books with them!
